# **NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN PROPOSAL**

# NORTH CADBURY AND YARLINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

A neighbourhood plan is a document produced after extensive local engagement which can influence the development of a local area. It defines an areas wants and future needs. A neighbourhood plan has several advantages over a parish or community plan the main ones are:

- It has statutory force as part of the SSDC local plan
- It has to be considered by local planning authorities as part of planning applications
- It has to be considered in planning application appeals

It has several steps, amongst these are:

- 1. Designation of the neighbourhood by SSDC
- 2. Building an evidence base
- 3. Publicity and engagement
- 4. Writing the plan
- 5. Independent examination of the plan
- 6 Referendum on the plan.
- 6. Approval by the local authority.

An estimate of the time taken to approve such a plan for North Cadbury and Yarlington Parish Council would be 18-24 months.
